## **Teacher Workshop Schedule- Fall 2010**

Reinstein Woods Environmental Education Center is offering FREE interdisciplinary workshops to help educators add environmental education to their existing curriculum. Participants at each workshop receive a standards-based curriculum and activity guide with lessons in English language arts, science, math, social studies and the expressive arts. Continuing education credit is available from many school districts.

### **Project WET Workshop**

**Thursday, September 23 from 4:30 to 7:30 PM**

Project WET helps K- 12 students explore water and water resources. The curriculum guide features 90 multidisciplinary lesson plans covering topics such as the physical and chemical characteristics of water, cultural connections to water, and water resource management.

### **Growing Up WILD Workshop**

**Saturday, October 9 from 9:00 AM to noon**

A new curriculum for educators of children ages 3 to 7, Growing UP WILD builds on children's sense of wonder about nature. Educators will receive an activity guide with 27 lesson plans correlated to Head Start Domains and the NAEYC standards. Lesson plans include ideas for art, music, centers, reading and math connections, and much more.

### **Project WILD Workshop**

**Wednesday, November 3 from 9:00 AM to noon**

This national, award-winning program helps K – 12 students to develop problem-solving skills and understand human interactions with wildlife and the environment. The curriculum guide includes more than 100 lesson plans covering one or more disciplines.

### **Flying WILD Workshop**

**Saturday, November 27 from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM**

Flying WILD helps middle-school teachers introduce students to bird conservation through classroom activities and environmental stewardship projects. The curriculum guide's activities can be used to initiate service-learning projects. Refreshments will be served.
